The goals of this internship program are designed to support and are aligned with the learning objectives of the academic component designed by Sacred Heart University (SHU). This program is a four week program offered in September and October for SHU students interested in pursuing a medical career. Students will live with host families, have time to explore on their own, while performing clinical rotations in a local hospital environment under the supervision of an assigned doctor. This program also offers options to include a one week intensive Spanish course, as well as, a social activities package to keep students engaged and interacting with other program participants during the program.

No previous knowledge of Spanish is required for this program.

### **Health Care**

### **Clinical Rotations**

Students interested in pursing a career in health care can now complement their university education through SHU's Medical Rotation program in Seville, Spain. GlobalEd's experience, staff, infrastructure and relationship with the health care sector in Seville, Spain offer an unparalleled study abroad opportunity. The development of programs likes these comes from years of networking with local hospitals and professionals in the healthcare sector. Program participants will work 20 hours per week under the supervision of a senior medical doctor to oversee and provide guidance and feedback to students in the areas of: from doctors from a wide range of disciplines and nurses in a hospital environment performing a wide range of functions.

Students are expected to perform many of the following during their clinical rotations:

- Obtain detailed histories and conduct physical exams, develop a differential diagnosis, formulate an assessment and plan through discussion with the preceptor, give oral presentations, and document findings
- Perform and/or interpret common lab results and diagnostics
- Educate and counsel patients across the lifespan regarding health-related issues
- Attend clinical rotations as scheduled in addition to grand rounds, lectures, and conferences, if available to them
- Demonstrate emotional resilience and stability, adaptability, and flexibility during the clinical year




# **Intensive Spanish**

#### **SPANISH LANGUAGE MODULE - \$250**

This is an optional program module for students interested in receiving a one week intensive Spanish course (20 hours) during the first week of the program. Immediately upon arrival and during the first week of the program, students will be placed in a one week intensive Spanish course in accordance with their competency level to facilitate their transition to the Spanish culture and language as soon as possible. In total, students will receive 20 hours of language instruction Monday through Friday for four hours per day, 9:00am to 1:00pm. GlobalEd currently works with a couple of accredited language schools in Seville to provide instruction to students of all language competency levels. Each student will be tested both prior to arrival and onsite to determine their Spanish level and placed in a class typically ranging from 6 to 10 students.

A weekly bulletin is publish with activities and excursions which program participants will have the opportunity to enjoy, in addition to the social activities coordinated by GlobalEd.



# **Medical Supervisor**

During the student's time at the clinic or hospital, the preceptor will be available for supervision, consultation, and teaching, or designate an alternate preceptor. In the case where supervision is not available, students may be given an assignment or may spend time with ancillary staff (x-ray, lab, physical therapy, etc.), as these experiences can be very valuable. The preceptor will be aware of the student's assigned activities at all times and participate in the planning of every shift. The first week's planning will be shared with student on the first day while given a tour of the hospital showing where all the shifts will be. The supervisor will also introduce the student to supporting staff.

It is understood that students are not employees of the hospitals or clinics and, therefore, work entirely under the preceptor's supervision. Students are not to substitute paid clinicians, clerical staff, or other workers at the clinical sites. Students will *never* be unsupervised. On each rotation, it is the student's responsibility to ensure that the supervising physician or preceptor also sees all of the student's patients. The preceptor can provide direct supervision of technical skills with gradually increased autonomy in accordance with the PA student's demonstrated level of expertise. However, every patient must be seen and every procedure evaluated prior to patient discharge. The preceptor must document the involvement of the PA student in the care of the patient in all aspects of the visit. The preceptor must also specifically document that the student was supervised during the entirety of the patient visit. The PA student will not be allowed to see, treat, or discharge a patient without evaluation by the preceptor.

#### Feedback to Students

Students will receive both regular and weekly feedback on their performance throughout the program.



# Excursions

Due to the short term of these programs combined with the expected low enrollment, excursions will not be included in the different sessions. However, the opportunity to participate in a pre-programmed semester excursion may be offered to program participants at an additional cost provided there is availability. Below, you may find some of the excursions typically offered during the semesters.



In southern Spain, along the Costa de la Luz, you will find the beaches of **Cadiz** with its 260 kilometres of coastline and some of the most beautiful beaches you could imagine. This Andalusian province is washed by the Atlantic Ocean and the Mediterranean Sea. It has many protected nature areas which include salt flats, sand dunes, pine forests, pastureland where fighting bulls are reared, springs, cliffs.



Spend the weekend in **Granada**, an evoking city where multiple civilizations that once lived on Andalusia soil left a cultural legacy that is a marvel of the world. The Alhambra is the joy that crowns this beautiful city at the foot of the Sierra Nevada mountain range.



Spend a day in **Cordoba** and explore its treasures starting with the Alcazar de los Reyes Cristianos. Walk through and enjoy the beauty of Córdoba's famous Mezquita, spectacular testimony to the Califalian age. Explore the Jewish quarter, full of life and great shops. Walk through Córdoba's streets including the "Callejón de las Flores" and "Plaza de los Gran Maimonides", stopping off at the Sinagogue.



### Housing



We consider housing accommodations to be a key element to the success of any study or work abroad experience. For this reason, we place considerable importance on understanding each student's lifestyle and interests and by carefully selecting each placement taking into consideration proximity, experience, amenities and past program evaluations. All placements typically have WIFI access and include reasonable use of utilities. Housing assignments are communicated prior to arrival in the form of a housing sheet and are designed to match the needs and expectations of each program participant. The detailed information in our housing sheets describes the housing accommodation, amenities, occupants, location, description of the neighborhood and a distance chart to local points of interest.
