

# BI199/299 Applied Microbiology in Irish History and Culture

May 12<sup>th</sup>-26<sup>th</sup>, 2018



Spend two weeks learning the basics of microbiological science through case studies related to Irish History and Culture in the beautiful environment of the Dingle Peninsula. Course activities include field trips to a local brewery, a distillery, streams and rivers for environmental sampling, a cooking school to create our own fermented foods and field sites related to The Great Hunger. This 3 credit foundational core course is offered at both non-majors (BI199) and biology majors level (BI299) and will also count towards the Wellness and Well Being TLA. Cultural activities include group dinners at a variety of local pubs, excursions to see surrounding archeological sites, an overnight trip to beautiful Killarney, a day trip to the Blasket Islands, and more.
